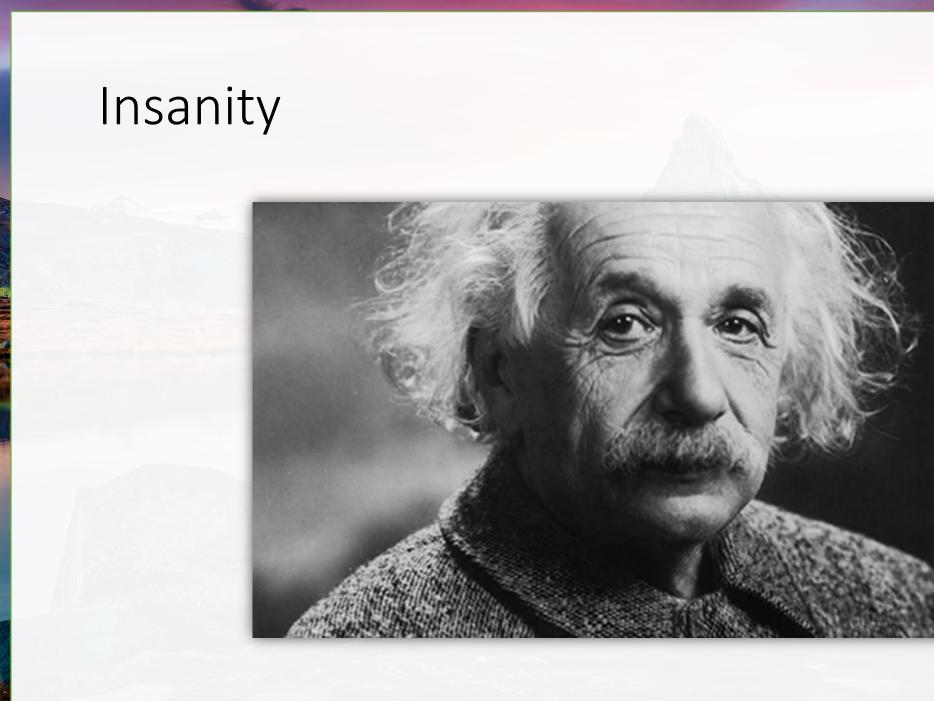

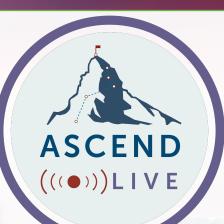

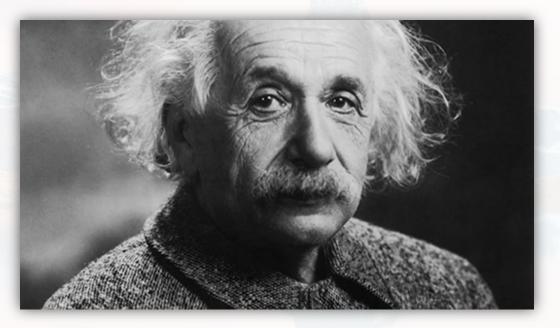

I have been submitting mostly digital applications for Assistant Principal positions. A couple of those jobs that would be my first choice, I have sent follow up emails inviting them to review my materials. Should I send those emails? Are they just irritating? Should I just submit my best application materials and hope for the best? Who should I send a follow up email to if there is no contact information in the posting? These are big districts. Should I send to the HR director? The principal? The Superintendent?

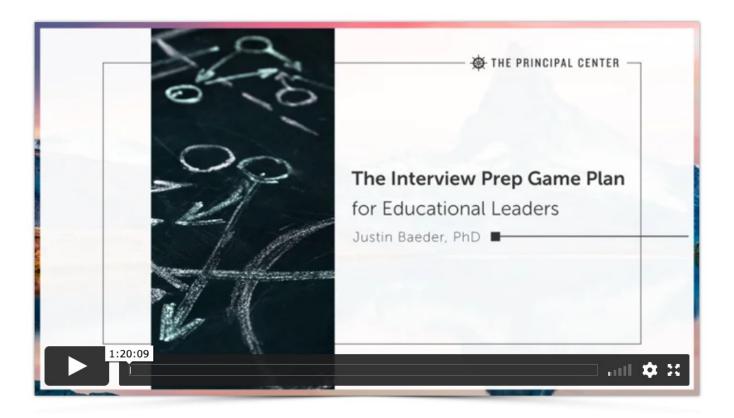

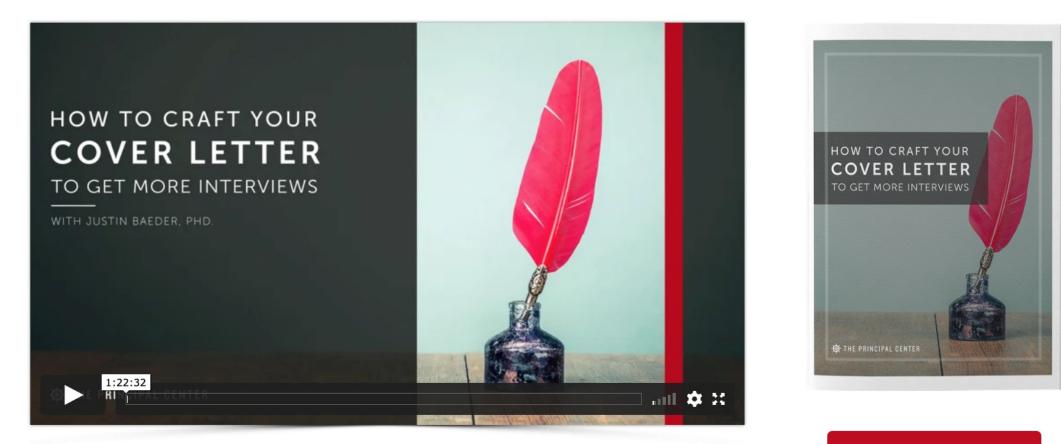
