 - Dog, because I'm hyper, loyal and you ask me to play fetch I will.


Public/Social Media Announcements

What is your favorite thing about being a PANTHER? The sense of community and a desire to be better today than we were yesterday. The attitude and the work ethic to be the best we can be.



Don't hand new hires over to their team/department right away



The Team/Department



- New hires should re-invigorate established teams
- This may be perceived as a threat
- Teams may also be grieving the loss of a colleague
- If new hires get a less-than-warm welcome from their team/department, they may be receptive to other offers



Making Introductions



- Meet together with the team
- Ask everyone to introduce themselves
- Share points of pride/distinctives
- State your vision for the team



Takeaways



- The contract alone isn't enough commitment
- Integrate new hires into your school community in as many ways as possible
- Invest 1:1 time introducing new hires to other staff
- Don't leave it up to teams/departments
