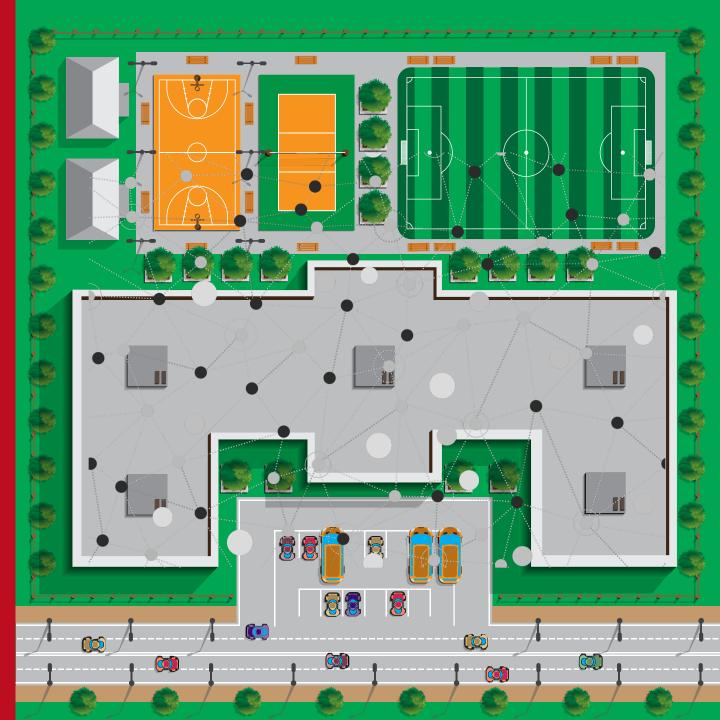

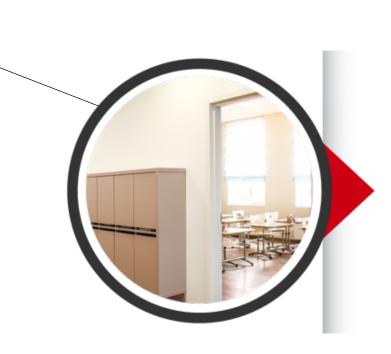

Level 4:

I visit every classroom every two weeks, and rotate my visits so I see each teacher at different times of day.

When Range Isn't Our Goal

- The Instructional Leadership Show # THE PRINCIPAL CENTER
- Seeing the best possible lesson: formal observation
- Focusing on an agreed-upon practice: coaching
- Documenting excellence: awards
- Documenting unacceptable performance: negative evaluations

Range Restriction

Evaluation Distortion

How will our appraisals of teachers' overall performance be distorted if we base them on observations of only

- One subject
- One period
- One time of day

Performance is Contextual

Every teacher teaches best in their:

- Favorite subject
- Favorite class of students

But many teachers have classes:

- Outside of their certification
- That they barely prep for
- That they don't enjoy teaching
- With students who are being affected

Plan for Range in Walkthroughs

- Have your office staff write out each teacher's schedule
- Write the date each time you visit a given class/subject
- Elementary: include exact times for each subject + recess

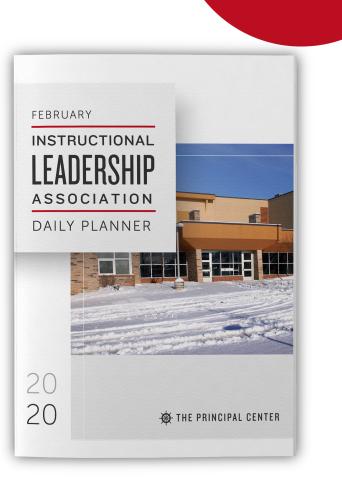

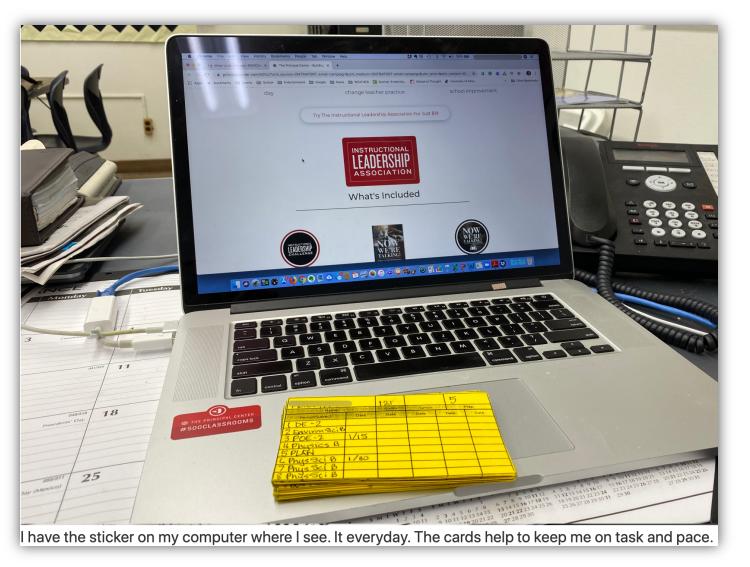

Planning Your Day

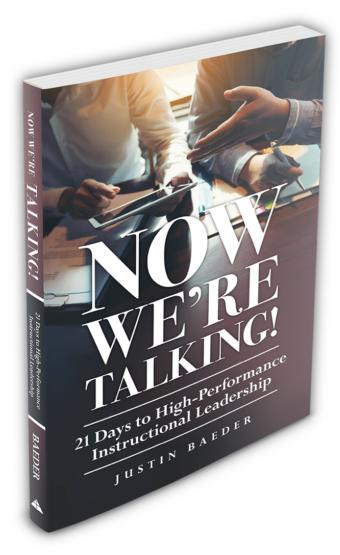
- Schedule on paper, on purpose

- Plan visits before + after duties, passing period, recess, lunch, etc.



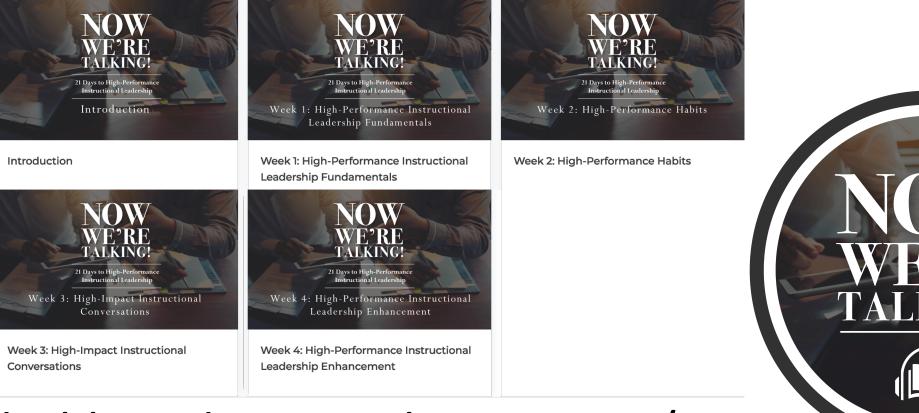
